About the Conference

Academics continue to engage with Gandhi's life and practices, particularly in addressing contemporary challenges such as ecological crises, economic inequality, and socio-political injustice. Nonetheless, a discernible gap persists between academic analyses of Gandhian thought and their practical application, prompting critical questions: To what extent do Gandhi's ideas, philosophy, and practices retain relevance in today's rapidly evolving world, shaped by technological advancements and digital transformation?

The key focus of this international conference is to engage with this complex and evolving landscape critically. The conference aims to assess Gandhi's relevance as a historical figure and a thinker whose ideas still offer significant solutions to present-day problems.

It will address the practical implications of Gandhi's philosophy in dealing with the multiple crises humanity faces today.

This conference explores why Gandhi's constructive programs, envisioned in the 1940s, remain pertinent to India's rural development and economic landscape. What is the enduring significance of Sarvodaya in an era marked by unprecedented economic disparity? Why have global green movements and Indian environmental campaigns acknowledged their indebtedness to Gandhian strategies for conflict resolution? Moreover, where have we, as a nation, faltered in implementing programs to reduce economic inequality, corruption, unemployment, communal tensions, and ecological degradation?

This conference also seeks to critically explore the complexities and nuances of Gandhi's thought, with the aim of assessing its relevance in addressing pressing global challenges. These challenges include climate change and environmental sustainability, economic inequality, unemployment, social disparities, and international conflicts.

By facilitating multidisciplinary dialogue, the conference will provide a platform for scholars, activists, and policymakers to engage in rigorous discussions on the continued applicability of Gandhi's ideas in the modern world.
